"More than 900 communities have lost their local newspapers in recent years, and regional publications have cut staff dramatically," Baccus said. "Quality local news outlets play a vital role as watchdogs of the public interest and promoters of community spirit and vitality. We are excited to offer this in our hometown of Lake Wales."

The local business community will be asked to support the endeavor by becoming Charter Sponsors. Individuals who love Lake Wales and believe it needs a news source will be encouraged to make a donation.

"Our readers will be invited to engage actively in the news site and to help promote community," Baccus said. "The site will be free, but registration will be required for full access and the ability to post comments. Classified ads, including up to 4 photos, also will be free."
